

Central Gurdwara (Khalsa Jatha) London

ANNOUNCEMENT

My name is Tom Murdoch. I am a partner at law firm Stone King LLP. The Charity Commission has appointed me as Interim Manager of the Central Gurdwara (Khalsa Jatha) London for the purpose of determining its Members.

If you consider that you are a Member, or are eligible to become a Member and would like to become a Member, you will be required to register your membership. This announcement sets out important information about what you will need to do to register your Membership.

Eligibility and types of Membership

Ordinary and Life Membership of the Gurdwara is restricted to Sehajdhari, Keshadhari and Amridhari Sikhs of either sex who have reached the age of 18. Ordinary membership is restricted to persons who live in one of the London Boroughs and who are not members of any other Sikh Temple in the UK. The subscription for Ordinary Members is £25 for a two-year term. The subscription for Life Members is £151. Associate Membership is open to anyone who pays the annual subscription of £5, but Associate Members have no voting rights at a general meeting.

What you need to do to register your Membership

If you consider that you are already any of the categories of Member above, or would like to become a Member, you will need to complete the Application Form, which accompanies this Announcement and is available on the Gurdwara's website.

You will need to bring the completed application with the ID (identification documents) set out in the application form to one of the Member Registration Sessions. These sessions will occur at the Edward Woods Community Centre at the following times:

- each Sunday at 6.30-8.00 pm between 5 and 26 November
- Wednesday 8 November at 6.30-8.00 pm in the evening
- Wednesday 22 November at 6.30-8.00 pm in the evening.

Verification of your Membership

Stone King will verify each application when the Registration Sessions are completed.

Registration Sessions will be attended by two representatives of the Gurdwara and will be filmed, to ensure that the Session proceeds smoothly. Stone King may also attend sessions. Following each Session, copies of ID and other relevant documents will be passed to Stone King with completed applications in order for Stone King to determine your membership. Copies of the documents supplied may be retained and used by Stone King and the Gurdwara for the purposes of determining and recording your membership. Your attendance at a Registration Session will be taken as your consent to the provisions of this paragraph.
